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# Annual General Meeting Minutes Edgemont Community Centre – Panorama Room May 18, 2022

#### 1. Call to Order

Bill Kirk called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. In accordance with the bylaws, the quorum for this meeting is the number of ECA members personally present and eligible to vote. Initially, the AGM was called for May 11, 2022 but no quorum was achieved so it was rescheduled. An attendance list is attached.

#### 2. Approve the Agenda

Moved by Elspeth Kirk that the agenda be approved as circulated. Seconded by Rick Wierzbicki. Carried.

#### 3. Minutes of May 12, 2021 AGM

Moved by Elspeth Kirk that the minutes of the May 12, 2021 AGM be approved. Seconded by Terry Meiyeppen. Carried.

#### 4. Appoint Scrutineers

Bill advised the assembly that should a vote be required we need to appoint scrutineers. Heather Gibbons and Deirdre Harris have agreed to serve in that role. Both are at arms-length from the Board.

#### 5. Reports

All reports were posted to the ECA website prior to the meeting.

- a. President's Report, Discussion and Acceptance
  Bill thanked the directors for their work over this past year. He noted that the past year's activities will be covered in the committee reports.
- b. Director Reports of Work of ECA for this Past Year, Discussion and Acceptance A motion to accept all reports will be presented as the end of this agenda item.

In turn each committee chairperson acknowledge their committees' membership.

- Building Administration Committee Elaine Scobie Highlights:
  - ✓ COVID prompted changes to the ECC staffing model as well as enhanced cleaning protocols.
  - Rental revenues are down which necessitated careful cost control measures.
  - ✓ The community centre has encounter severe damage to the structure. The
    committee has a rebuilding plan. To activate the plan, the committee has
    secured funding, design elements, and necessary permits. The plan is staged

- over three years to maximize access to grant funding. Urgent matters will be considered in year one with onsite work scheduled to begin mid-June to early July.
- On another matter related to the building, Elaine reported that the light fixtures are obsolete and new tubes are no longer being manufactured. The strategy is to replace the fixtures in the Mountain View Room and Northrock Room immediately and use the tubes salvaged from that effort to supplement tubes in the Panorama Room and hallways as they burn out. Eventually, all fixtures will be replacing.
- Elaine introduced the community hub project and indicated that the committee is looking for volunteer help to put the outdoor furniture together.
- Human Resources Committee Elaine Scobie

Elaine advised that the HR Committee has been active this past year in both managing staff resources and recruiting staff members to support the work of the Board and volunteers.

#### ELM – Rick Wierzbicki

Rick provided an overview of ELM's activities over the past year and plans for the coming year. He warned that there is likely to be an increase in the ELM levy in the fall. A 3% increase is allowed by the City and Edgemont has never implemented an increase. The rising costs are likely to prompt such an increase. In addition, some tasks which would normally take place on an annual basis such as fertilizing will be deferred until next year.

# Volunteer Report – Rick reported on behalf of Jeff Edwards Rick reviewed the ECA activities for which Jeff and others have recruited volunteers. Jeff would like to share the Volunteer Coordinator's job as it has become too large for one person to handle.

# Programs – Rick reported for Barb Elms One of the major challenges to the program schedule has been the COVID restrictions on the use of the gym. ECA is confident we will be able to use the gym over the summer and going forward. A new activity in the coming months will be the Farmers' Market. The first market will be held on June 19.

#### Disc Golf – Rick

Rick reviewed the disc golf project and its current status. The course is being well used.

Moved by Elspeth Kirk that the President's and Directors' Reports be accepted. Seconded by Terry Meiyeppen. Carried.

#### c. Audited Statements, Discussion and Acceptance

Terry presented the audit. ECA has received a clean, unqualified audit report. He reviewed the balance sheet and the profit/loss statement. In addition, he noted that ECA has moved its banking to the National Bank and outsourced its payroll processing.

The ELM financial statements have been included as an addendum to the audit statements. Terry explained why the ELM financial were not included in the formal audit.

Terry thanked the Board, his committee members, and the ECA staff including Brenda Gonzalez, bookkeeper, for their support.

Moved by Rick Wierzbicki that the 2021 audit financial statements including the ELM addendum be approved. Seconded by Elaine Scobie. Carried.

Appointment of the Auditor for 2022 Financials
 Moved by Terry Meiyeppen that ECA engage an auditor for 2022 through the Federation of Calgary Communities. Seconded by Shaffic Fazal. Carried.

#### 6. Election of the Board

Rick chaired the Nomination Committee. He reported that the four Directors whose terms expire at the adjournment of this meeting have all expressed interest in serving another two-year term. There are five positions to be filled.

Bill made three calls for nominations from the floor. Receiving none, he closed nominations and announced the following would be elected by acclamation:

# President's Report

- The year since the May 2022 AGM has been challenging and I'd like to acknowledge all the volunteers and staff who have stepped up to those challenges. Getting back into a rhythm takes time. I'd also like to thank Heather Gibbons and now Eric MacKenzie, our Neighbourhood Partnership Coordinators from the City, who provide advice and support when needed.
- As many of you are aware, it's been a major undertaking to do the repairs to the building. We have completed Phase 1 and are into Phase 2. Although necessary, we recognize the disruption to some of the programs and we have done our utmost to ensure that any concerns from our long term renters, in particular, have been addressed.
- One concern that I want to raise is that over the summer, a number of small fires were set behind the building. Fortunately, no serious damage occurred but if you see anything unusual happening at our centre, call the police.





- ECA Board undertook a complete review of the association's bylaws. Our mission was to simplify them and make sure they accurately reflected the way we do business now. Mission accomplished. We have confirmation from Corporate Registry that our bylaws are acceptable and have been filed. The next step is to update our policies and committee terms of reference. That work has started.
- In reviewing how we do business we have made a conscious effort to utilize technology to our advantage. We have migrated our online membership renewals and program registrations to Communal, a service developed specifically for associations like outs. So far, so good.
- We have energized our online presence to advertise our programs. If you have an email registered with ECA, you will received messages. You'll also find us on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram.
- Funding comes in the form of grants, membership dues and casinos. We have a "specialist" in Barb Elm who seems to be able to find dollars in the unlikeliest places and Elaine Scobie who rounded up the 40 volunteers to work a casino. What we are able to do with those dollars, is simply amazing.

### Some of the activities we've done:

- Built a community hub and created a mural to recognize volunteers who were community builders throughout their time in Edgemont.
- Offered programs for children and adults. A complete list is in every Edgemont newsletter.
- Published 12 issues of *Inside Edgemont* delivered to every civic address in our community
- Served the community through the Edgemont Networking Group (a board committee) with the Christmas Hamper Program, Good Food Box, Breakfast Club, Basically Babies, etc. with recent effort focussed on helping families through catastrophic events.
- Disc golf has been a popular addition with the course used throughout the year as was the outdoor rink, the City added pickle ball courts to the tennis courts at the Reservoir Park.
- Applications to the City of Calgary that touch on area planning are reviewed by ECA with any comments and concerns forwarded to the City.
- Beautified the neighbourhood through the ELM program.

# **ECC HUB Project**

- During the various stages of pandemic restrictions, outdoor
  activities became very popular and we found that many people
  chose to come to the community centre to meet up for visits, exercise
  and play dates for the kids, as well as enjoying the Food Trucks.
- Further emphasising this, last year Edgemont lost two people who had been great advocates for the value of community, Lois Uptigrove and Linda Connolly. Friends of Linda started plans for a memorial that would be useful to our community.
- This all came together in a plan to create a hub at the community centre, with picnic tables, benches and a notice board.
- ECA applied for funding from a Government of Canada initiative to support projects such as ours and our application was successful.
- Matching funds were provided by Friends of Linda, Northwest Community Church and the ECA.

 We continue to look at creative ways (e.g., by using donated perennials) to stay within our budget given the cost increases that our service providers are encountering.

 We wish to thank Able Landscaping for services provided over the past years.
 For 2023, however, we are looking forward to working with Foothills Landscaping for our ELM program.



- Very successful year for all aspects of the ELM Program with flowers looking wonderful well into September. Flowers will remain in place as long as possible in 2023.
- Started to incorporate perennials donated by residents into flower beds.
- Currently investigating naturalization possibility with city experts. May commence pilot in 2024 on steep slope by Fire Hall



- Shari Pitka, our ELM
   Program Coordinator, again provided excellent services this year, including communication and interaction with residents while proposing great, creative ideas on how to continue to develop and deliver the ELM program.
- In March, Shari put on a very successful and well received presentation for Edgemont residents, Landscaping 101.

- The entrance sign garden bed at John Laurie Blvd now features some Karl Foerster grasses and perennials donated by Edgemont residents. This garden bed will continue to be enhanced.
- A group of volunteers cleaned up Park EDG119 off Edgebrook Boulevard near Hamptons CO-OP. The weeding party consisted of residents and students who spent two days cleaning out the area close to the steps at the parking lot. The city supported the party by lending equipment!



# ELM Budget 2023

- Not all scheduled tasks could be carried out in 2022 due to labour shortages; therefore, monies set aside for specific jobs will be used early 2023 to catch up on outstanding maintenance.
- Mowing costs have increased significantly due to sharp increases in diesel fuel prices over the last year.
- Cost permitting, we plan to aerate and fertilize this year.
- The special Tax Levy was increased by the maximum 3% (\$2.54 per annum) for 2023 to offset rising costs due to inflation. Towards the end of the summer, the amount of the current Tax Levy will be reviewed.
- As in 2022, the City will be picking up a greater share of the irrigation costs this season saving ELM about \$10,000.00

#### **ELM Program Financial Review 2022**

The ELM program is supervised by the City of Calgary and operates in a payout method when expenses are incurred. To a large degree the City acts as our fiscal agent. They hold the annual grant, the tax levy, and the carry forward from the previous year and disperse the funds to the ECA when invoices are submitted.



The City advised us in 2021, that ELM does not need an annual audit because of the unnecessary expense. Instead, the ECA reviews the final numbers to ensure the city and ECA numbers match. This review is added at the end of the annual audit report as a line-item addendum.

Any money generated outside of the ELM grants and tax levy, (donations, sale of worn assets, payments for damage to ELM property, insurance settlements), is kept in an ECA operated ELM bank account and applied to ELM expenses.

The ELM program operated within budget for 2022 and the ledgers of the ECA and the City matched
